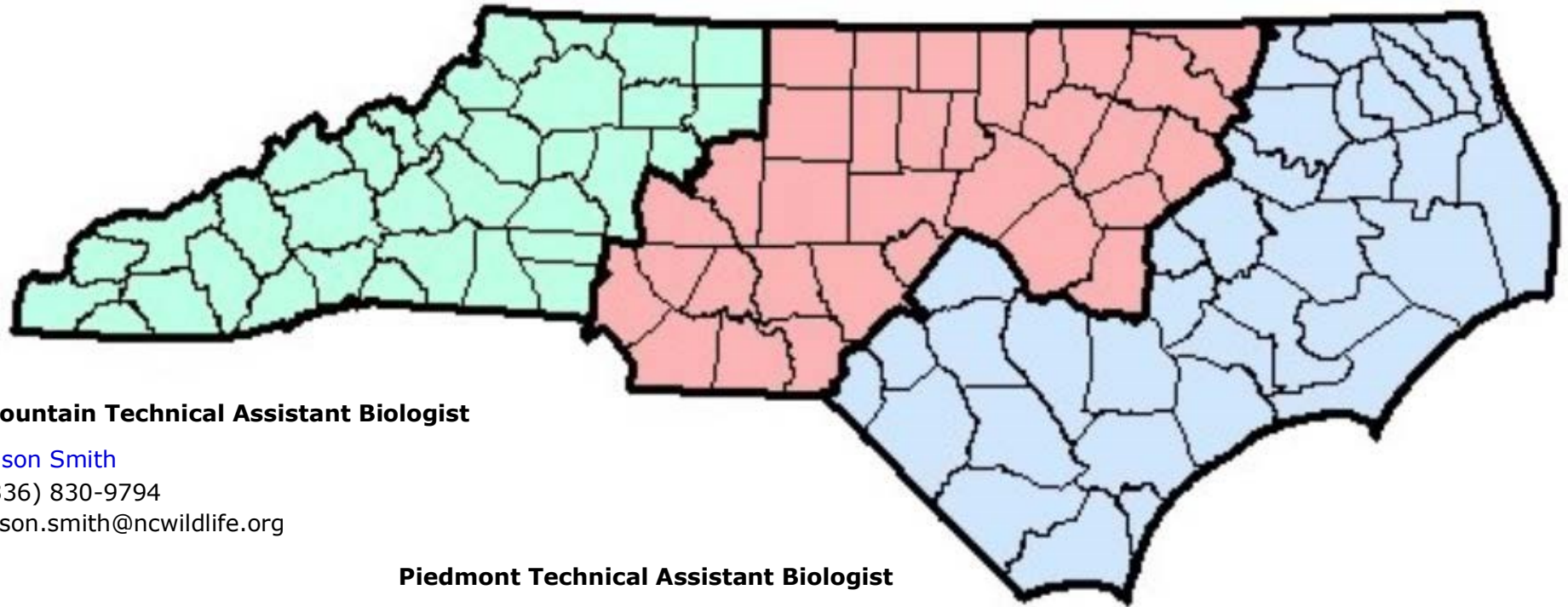

## Technical Assistance Biologists - Forest Stewardship

The Forest Stewardship Technical Assistance Biologists (TABs) primary responsibility is to work with landowners to develop comprehensive forest management plans with wildlife as the primary focus. Landowners interested in managing their forested lands for multi-use resources including timber production, wildlife habitat, soil and water quality improvements, recreational opportunities, and aesthetics can seek guidance from one of these biologists. Forest Stewardship plans are developed in partnership with the North Carolina Forest Service and other natural resource professionals. Landowners with 10 or more acres of privately held forested land are eligible for stewardship plans. These TABs also work with landowners who are interested in enrolling their property into the Wildlife Conservation Lands Program. See back cover for more information on this program.
